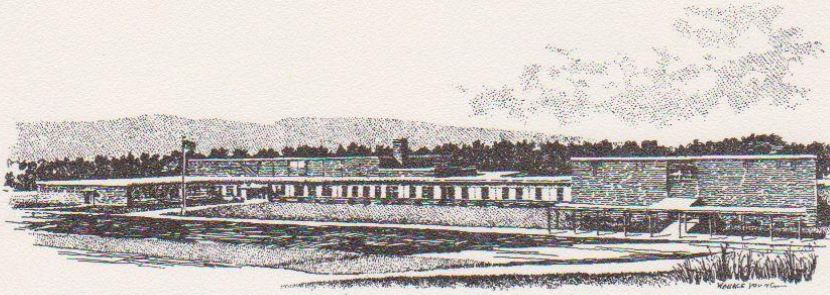

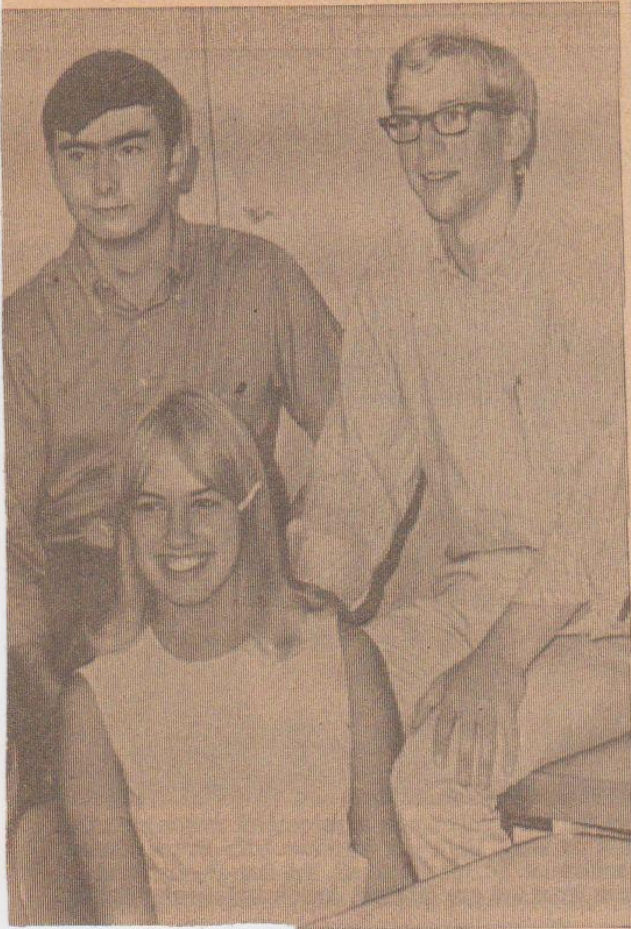

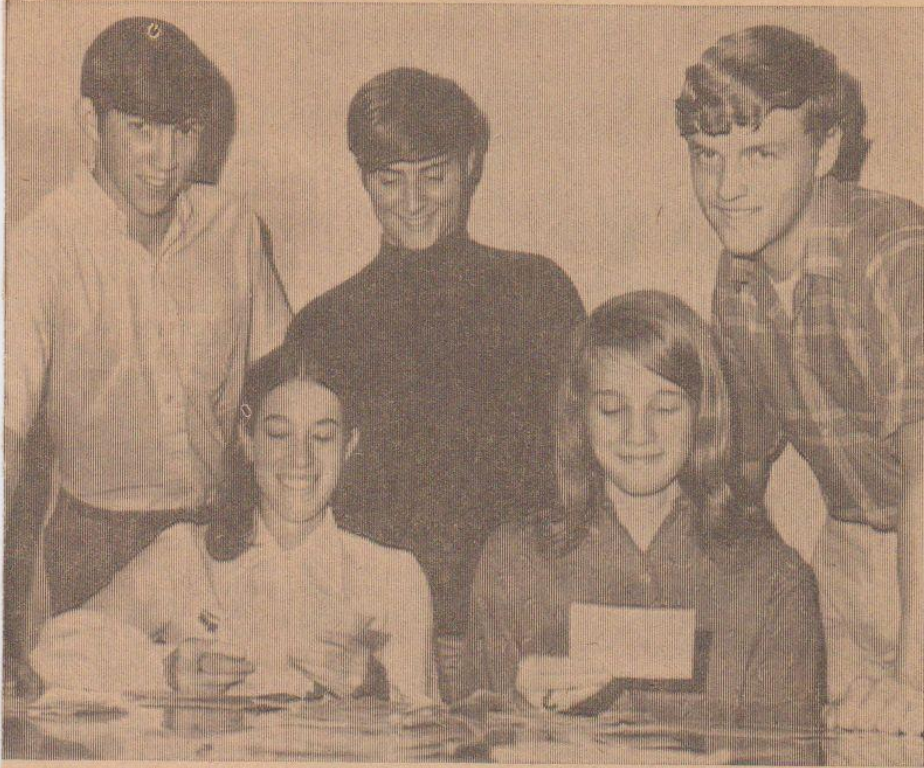

The organizers of this project at West are Mr. Clyde Colwell and Mr. Gerald Gale. Mr. Gale is, in his own words, the "road man". He is the one who lines up the jobs. He does this by talking to the Chambers of Commerce and various employers in the area. He also provides on the job supervision. After Mr. Gale lines up the job he and Mr. Colwell decide which student gets which job. This decision is very important, because they must place the right student with the right job. If they do not make the right choice, as sometimes happens, the student does not work out on the job, and loses it.

The program is presently open to Seniors in the Special Class. However, both Mr. Gale and Mr. Colwell feel it should be expanded to the entire school. They both said they think that there are many students in the school who are not in the Special Class that do not want to go to college, and that could benefit from on-the-job training. Under a reimbursement plan

They enjoy working — it gives them a feeling of accomplishment. It also helps them start good habits — such as saving money. The type of job held by the students varies, but often they do the general utility work. They work at such places as the Box Factory and Northside Floral Shop. 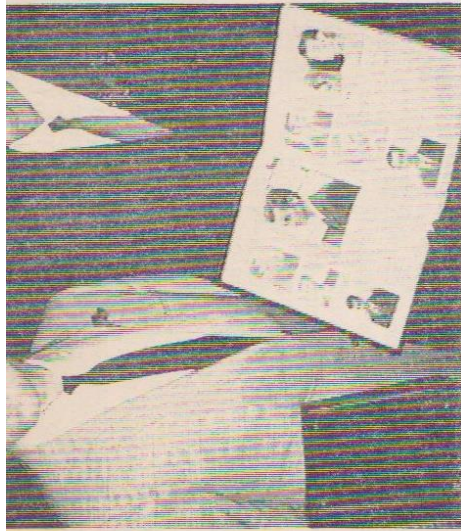

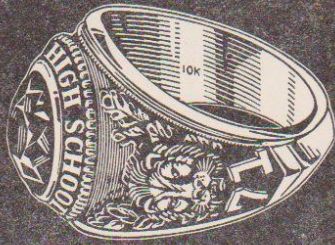

A Commencement Day Address

When you start trying to do something about these problems, you become a problem—and who needs more problems? So watch it. If one of you comes ambling up to my house someday and tries to drag me out of my easy chair to do some fool thing—like vote—I'll hit you with my beer can.

And while we're on the subject of agitation, I'd like to say a few words to you nig-uh, that is, you Afro-Congolese Americans, or whatever the devil you are this week. I just like to say that I'm real proud of all the progress you people have made so far in the field of civil rights. Why, some of my best friends are—er, you-know-what, and I think it's just wonderful the way you've kept the faith, baby, and had a lot of soul, over-come this and that, and all that other rubbish. But for God's sake, will you cool it already? I mean, it's getting so I can't turn on my T.V. without your people staring back at me. Now I'm as liberal as the next guy, and I love your fried chicken, but haven't you done enough for a while? Why, you can eat at a restaurant, ride in the front of the bus, go into the Elks Club—sometimes—just as if you were real human beings! So quiet down, huh? Don't go stirring up the neighborhood. As a matter of fact, don't go into the neighbor-

hood.

Well, students, there it is. Today you have completed your education

to live in this world. We've also given you a society to be proud of, mouth questions. My generation has built up the most affluent nation in history. We've overcome a World War, a Korean War, and a Cold War—and all for your sake. My generation has done everything except learned how to live with ourselves. That's our record. You top it. And the best way to do that, of course, is to forget your ideals, shut up, and accept the system in order to make a buck. And when you've done all that, the day will come when you'll look at yourself in the mirror—if you're still able to without vomiting—and say to

yourself "I am Mature." Further more . . .

Nobody knows what else Dr. Preston had to say, for it was at that time the students emerged from their customary stupor and crammed their caps and gowns into his face. While the Honored Guests tried to revive him, the Future of America went out and burned their diplomas along with the school. Dr. Preston agreed to pay for half the damages, providing Dr. Spock paid the other half, and issued a statement apologizing to the public for his candor. "I didn't mean to be so blunt," he said. "but on the other hand, I didn't say anything which hasn't been said before."

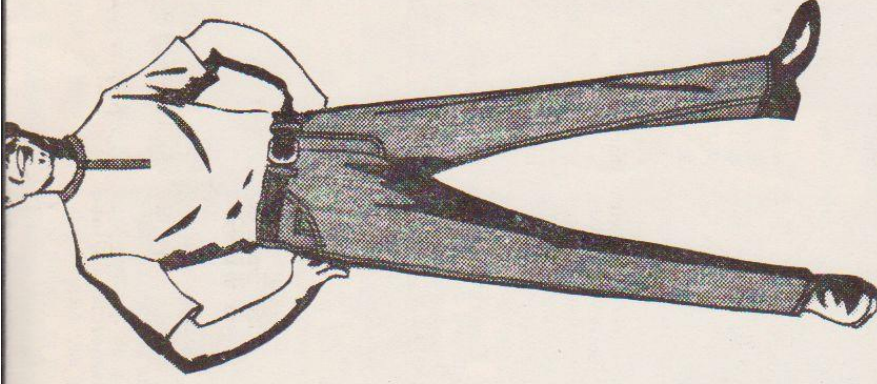
