Each year the Corning Lions Club at its annual football dinner honoring the football squads of East and West High schools presents a medal to the outstanding backfield player and lineman of the year.





EAST HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL HISTORY

Never before have the East High Trojans had as much at stake as tonight's eighth meetwith arch-rival West — for tonight the Trojans are shooting for an undefeated season and undisputed first place in the Sullivan Trail Conference.

If Coach Bill Johnson's team can turn the trick, it would be the first undefeated team in the school's history and the first to win the STC championship. The Trojans can do no worse than a tie for the STC crown, even if they are defeated. A tie tonight would also give them the title and honors of being the Number 1 team in the area.

In rolling past its seven foes this campaign, East has scored 186 points and surrendered only 28. The first team defense has given up but three points — that a field goal turned in by Hornell.

The stout East defense has two back-toback shutouts going into tonight's action, first Elmira Free Academy and then, last week, Sayre.

East's offensive this year has been explosive and balanced. All four backs are averaging over 5 yards per carry: Frank Yorio, 6.9, average with four TD's; Jim Darcangelo, 5.2 average, 7 TD's; Mickey Reilly, 5.1 average, 4 TD's and Bob Doran, 7.2 average, 5 TD's.

Tonight's outcome might very well hinge on the physical condition of senior quarterback Doran, who missed the Sayre game with a groin injury. His availability was a "day-to-day" thing

as the Trojans worked out this week. In Doran's absence, Dave Martuscello was scheduled to take over.

With the seven wins without defeat this year, East's overall record since the school opened in 1963 stands at 34 wins, 26 loses and two ties.

Tonight's winner also takes a lead in the tough series, as both the Vikings and the Trojans have won three and lost three. One ended in a tie.

West won the opener between the two schools in 1963, 7-6, but East bounced back in 1964, 25-13. The '65 clash ended up tied, 14-14. East won, 6-0 in 1966, but then West got two in a row, winning in '67, 20-7 and '68, 13-0. Last year, the Trojans prevailed, 20-0.


Coach Johnson's club started with a bang this year, ripping Elmira Notre Dame, 38-6. The Trojans followed this with big wins over Elmira Heights, 41-6; Hornell, 41-3 and Elmira Southside, 34-6.

East outlasted Horseheads, 14-7 and then scored the first win ever over Elmira Free Academy, 14-0—and did it at Elmira's Parker Field.

Last week, the Trojans handed Sayre its first defeat in 19 games, out-slugging the Redskins in the mud, 4-0.

Coach Johnson not only lauds every member of this year's team for their contributions, but also gives much credit to the Trojan's success to his two assistant coaches, Joe Corcoran and George Bunnell.

WEST HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL HISTORY

West will be seeking its 36th football victory and 15th in Sullivan Trail Conference and fourth over East in the traditional encounter with the undefeated Trojans tonight.

Going into the final game of its 8th year of grid competition, West has an overall record of 35 wins, 23 losses and five contests ended in deadlocks.

A breakdow of the West record against opponents follows:

Wellsville (5-0-0), Waverly (1-0-0), Hornell (7-1-0), Athens (2-1-0), Elmira Heights (5-2-1), Horseheads (5-3-0), Batavia (1-1-1), Wellsboro (1-1-0), C-PP East (3-3-1), Elmira Notre Dame (4-4-0), Elmira Southside (1-3-1), Elmira Free Academy (0-4-1).

The Viking record by seasons is 4.4-0 in 1963, 5-3-0 in 1964, 4-2-2 in 1965, 0-7-1 in 1966, 7-1-0 in 1967, 6-0-2 in 1968, 5-3-0 in 1969 and 4-3 up to tonight's game.

Since the STC was organized in 1966, West has amassed an overall record of 14-9-2 and won its lone championship in 1968 with a 4-0-2 mark.

Although West is out of the title race, Coach Arnie Northrop's club has scoring potential having tallied 126 points while allowing 82. Against STC foes the Vikings have scored 94 points while giving up 64.

Offensively the Key Vikings to watch are Mark Norris, the club's high scorer with 50

points and other fine runners Randy Fuller and Scott Naylor. Quarterback Pudge Breitwise has tossed 7 touchdown passes with Jeff Kenyon and Rick Gehl the top receivers.

While posting a 4-3 record West has beaten Horseheads 20-13, Waverly 26-6, Elmira Notre Dame 45-7 and Hornell 27-8 while losing to Elmira Southside 12-2, Elmira Free Academy 24-0 and Edison High of Elmira Heights, 12-6.

During the first four years of football at West, Larry Warshawsky was the coach and his teams notched a 13-16-3 record. Northrop took over in 1967 and his clubs have registera 22-7-2 win-loss-tie mark.

In 1964 West had a 3-1 record in the now disbanded West Central Football Conference to share the title with East and Batavia.

The 1967 Viking team holds the school's offsensive record scoring 164 points while the 1968 aggregation possesses the best defensive mark limiting rivals to 46 points.

The all-time West individual scoring record is held by Mike Bennett who registered 60 points in 1967. Other seasonal leaders were the late Ed Hanshaw and Kenneth Morse with 12 each in 1963, Walt Blodgett with 36 in 1964 and 49 in 1965, Bob Warner with 48 in 1968 and Howard Green with 38 in 1969.

Holder of the all-time Viking point after touchdown record is Don Smith, who booted 15 through the uprights in 1964.
